Re:	Lyme Disease

With most Nova Scotians now living in an area considered at higher risk for contracting Lyme disease, the Nova Scotia College of Pharmacists (NSCP) is in ongoing communication with the Department of Health and Wellness (DHW) regarding how pharmacists could play a larger role in the prevention of Lyme disease.

Currently, pharmacists can continue to play a critical role by answering questions from individuals seeking information about prevention and treatment.
